### HOW THE COLLEGE OPPORTUNITY FUND TUITION STIPEND WORKS: ELIGIBLE STUDENTS, PUBLIC COLLEGES, ACADEMIC YEAR 2011-2012

\*Tuition is based on full-time enrollment of 15 credit hours per semester for the full academic year (not including summer session) for Colorado residents during the 2011-2012 academic year. The College Opportunity Fund stipend is \$62 per credit hour (\$1,860 for 30 hours) during the 2011-2012 academic year at participating public institutions or \$31 at participating private schools.

### WHAT IS IT?

The College Opportunity Trust Fund (COF), created by the Colorado Legislature, provides a stipend to eligible undergraduate students. The stipend pays a portion of your total resident tuition when you attend a Colorado public institution or a participating private institution.

### ELIGIBILITY

Eligible students include undergraduates classified as resident students for tuition purposes and enrolled at state colleges and universities. Additionally, undergraduate students enrolled at participating private colleges or universities *may* be eligible if the college or university is approved for the program by the Colorado Commission on Higher Education and the student meets certain eligibility requirements.
